**STEWARDSHIP AND CLEANING DUTIES** Volunteers are required for cleaning duties for St Aloysius Church. It is hoped that St James Church will re-open for Mass in October, we will need people to act as stewards and to clean the church after each opening. Those over 70 are in the clinically vulnerable group and are at a higher risk of severe illness from coronavirus, however if you still wish to volunteer you will be asked to confirm that you have read and understood the protocol, the Diocesan Handbook for Re- Opening of Churches and HM Government Guidance on Staying alert and safe (social distancing) and must sign a volunteer declaration. **NORTHERN CROSS** The lockdown and church closures have caused their sales at weekend Mass to cease. They have reached a "Northern Crossroads". **THE RETURN OF MASSES** We celebrate Mass at St Aloysius on:

- **Wednesday at 7pm.**
- **Saturday at 6pm.**
- **Sunday at 11am.**
- Please don't come if you have a temperature or the other symptoms of coronavirus.
- You must use the hand sanitiser when you enter church and as you leave.
- Please follow the one-way system, up the side aisles and down the centre aisle.
- When Fr Simon is receiving Holy Communion he will say loudly **The Body of Christ** we will say together **Amen**. So that when we receive communion we will say nothing.
- Once we have received communion we must leave church.
- If you want to talk to someone you must do it in the car park, keeping social distances.
- If there are any questions please see Fr Simon.

Due to Government ruling masks **MUST** be worn at all Church Services/Masses and you will have to ring this phone number **07594918476** (change of mobile number) to leave your name and phone number to book a place for weekend Masses (we are only allowed 100 people to attend). You don't need to book a place for Wednesday Mass but you **MUST** wear a mask. Those who are still in isolation or would rather not risk coming to Church just yet, the Bishops of England and Wales have continued to release us from the Sunday Obligation as they did at the beginning of the lockdown.
